

**Status of Coronavirus Emergency Financial Aid to Students (Federal Reporting)
Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds III (ARP)**

Public Law 117-2

- Alamance Community College (College) signed and returned to the Department of Education (Department) the College's Certification and Agreement for Student Financial Aid Grants to Students under the ARP-HEERF III, Public Law 117-2. This includes assurance that the College has used, or intends to use, no less than \$4,309,066 of the funds received under Section 2003 (a)(1) of the American Rescue Plan Act to provide Financial Aid Grants to students.
- As of March 31, 2022, Alamance Community College received \$6,676,852 for students to fund the Federal Emergency Financial Aid Grants, Student Portion. This total includes \$1,183,893 under HEERF I-CARES; \$1,183,893 under HEERF II-CRRSAA; and \$4,309,066 under HEERF III-ARPA.
- The total funds disbursed to students in 2023 Quarter Two were \$40,990.96 (Financial Aid) from the Student Portion and \$5,000 (TRIO SSS scholarships) from the Institutional Portion.
- The estimated total number of students potentially eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid grants in 2023 Quarter Two was 2,608 in spring semester and 1,517 in summer semester.
- The total number of students who received a Student Portion Financial Aid Grant in 2023 Quarter Two was 85. The total number of students who received a grant from the Institutional Portion was 10.
- Students eligible for grants were enrolled Spring 2023 semester and/or Summer 2023 semester; were Title-IV eligible; were not dually-enrolled secondary school students; were curriculum students or workforce development students in credential-granting programs; and included international and DACA students.
- Students received emergency grants in 2023 Quarter Two by two methods. Those were:
 - Student Portion: Funds available due to expired, uncashed checks of previous emergency grant recipients were allocated in the following manner: Individual students could request additional funding based on attesting to a negative impact on their household due to COVID-19. Applicants with available unmet financial need (FAFSA) were awarded up to \$1,000 and other applicants were awarded up to \$500.
 - Institutional Portion: Students who joined the TRIO Student Support Services program during the quarter were allocated \$500 awards from the Institutional Portion to assist with cost of attendance. All students receiving awards were low-income students, first-generation college students, or students with disabilities.
